Lecture & Slide Show
Sunday, January 15, 2012

November honors Native American heritage

On Sunday afternoon, November 20, 2011, one of the last events of the 250th anniversary celebrations of the founding of Amherst County was held at Bear Mountain in Amherst County. It was co-presented by the Amherst County Museum, the Monacan Ancestral Museum and Amherst Glebe Arts Response, Inc. (AGAR).

The program was introduced by Chief Sharon Bryant. The Monacan Youth Dancers performed before a showing of AGAR's oral history documentary film, "Bear Mountain Indian Mission School." After the film there was a panel of Monacans who spoke about their years as students at the Bear Mountain Indian Mission School. Panelists were former Chief Kenneth Branham, Betty Hicks, Herbert Hicks, Betty Branham, Brenda Garrison, RN, and Bertie Branham.

Also present were three non-Monacan residents of Amherst County whose mothers taught at Bear Mountain Indian Mission School: Helen Massie, daughter of Mrs. Smith, Elvira Morse, daughter of Mrs. Whitehead, and Thurman B. Davis, son of Mrs. Davis, who all spoke about how much their mothers had enjoyed teaching at the school. After the panel presentation, those in attendance were invited to tour the Monacan Ancestral Museum, led by Curator and Director Loraine "Littlewolf" Griffith. Two rooms of the Museum are restored school rooms of the Bear Mountain Indian Mission School. Both the school restoration and the AGAR film were funded in part by the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities.

County history featured on ArtMeters

Amherst County High School is pleased to participate in the creation of three ArtMeters that were recently installed in downtown Amherst. The artists, all sophomores from the studio of Maryellen Barron, were given the topic "250 Years of Amherst County" to come up with an original design for the meters. Taylyn Soult, Art Club co-President for 2011-12, designed a meter that highlights Celtic heritage and bears a message of goodwill in Gaelic. Alison Hyler, Art Club member, painted a portrait of a Native American woman. Guided by Holly Mills, Amherst County Museum Director, we learned that Chief Powhatan's niece Nicketti, also a cousin to Pocahontas, was a Pamunkev Indian who lived in this area. Though no portrait of Nicketti exists, Alison portrayed a natural beauty that symbolizes strength. The figure also pays tribute to the Monacan tribe of Amherst county. The meter painted by Kenna Dixon features the home Edgewood on Garland Avenue, built c. 1818. The scene shows the elegant facade and a blooming garden in the rear.

Each student went through the process of research, surface preparation, drawing and painting the meters with assistance from Ms. Barron. The group put in many after-school hours to complete the project, and the result was exceptional. "I was glad to be given this opportunity; I want my artists to be involved in the community," Ms. Barron commented. The Art Meters were unveiled prior to the Christmas Parade on Friday, December 2.
